- Commit to replicating Nature-inspired systems that vest power at the lowest level and support the good of all.
- Adapt and restore our natural individual and collective stores of resiliency to replace the hierarchical, male-dominant, power-over paradigm of Growth-Greed-Capitalism.
- Claim the self-governance of our communities modeling Nature's efficient, integral, holistic and symbiotic design that vests power at the lowest level: You, me and We.
- Establish Shared Wisdom Circles, supported by local Community Councils, dedicated to creating shared wisdom for the benefit of all in their community.
- Organize Community Councils, comprised of Delegates elected by the Shared Wisdom Circles, which are committed to:
 - Inviting community conversations to discern and adopt the best Shared Wisdom for our community,
 - Hosting regular forums to embrace the civic self-determination of stakeholders in communities of belonging, and
 - Publishing and maintaining an accessible library of community Shared Wisdom for the good of all.
- Empower Community Councils to organize community Self-Governance Circles, which administer the ProSocial World's ™ design tools to maintain an optimally functioning community committed to the good of all.
- Replicate Community Councils in ever-widening Circles to expand self-governance at bio-regional, continental, and global levels, all committed to assisting local Shared Wisdom for the good of all.

The world we seek is not only possible, it is already being born through us.

1. Equity, Justice and Cultural Respect

As a Community:

- We stand for the rights and dignity of every individual, ensuring equitable access to resources, opportunities, and voice in community governance,
- We reject systems of oppression and domination that marginalize any person or group, and we encourage vibrant partnership,
- o We celebrate cultural diversity as a strength that enriches our society, and
- We welcome the stranger, recognizing that all humans share a common ancestry.

2. Sustainability and Stewardship

As Caretakers of the good of all, we pledge to:

- o Protect biodiversity and encourage Nature's regenerative powers,
- o Prioritize long-term stewardship over short-term gain,
- o Minimize 'externalities' and negative impacts generated by human activity, and
- o Ensure that human activity nurtures the health and wellbeing of all life.

3. Community Empowerment For the Good of All Through Shared Wisdom As Self-Governing Communities:

In ever-widening circles, from communities to the world, decentralized, self-governing communities empower 'We The People' to nurture respectful collaboration and community self-governance as we co-create a world that works for the good of all.

4. Mutual Aid and Solidarity:

We recognize our shared humanity and the importance of supporting one another:

- We commit to co-creating networks of support that prioritize mutual aid over competition and to lifting each other up.
- We commit to bringing our hands, hearts and minds together as we mobilize, organize, and embark on a shared path of <u>symbiotic</u> transformational development for the good of all in our communities and the world.
- Solidarity is the crucial coherent response to address disparities and crises.

5. Informed Citizenship:

- We reclaim our civic voices as engaged stakeholders in communities of belonging, through the practices of Shared Wisdom circles and self-governance, and
- In addition to reclaiming our right to self-governance, we maintain transparency and the right to access information that affects our lives.

6. Health and Well-being:

- Health is a fundamental right. It starts by ensuring that our environment nurtures the regeneration of all life.
- Wellbeing is more than just the absence of suffering. We commit to ourselves and each other to support lifelong practices that lead to measurable rising levels of resiliency, mutual respect, care, happiness, serenity and self-actualization.
- Comprehensive healthcare, including mental, emotional and wellness care is accessible to everyone.
- We reclaim all rights over the wellbeing of our planet and our bodies, including the right to choose the manner of our dying.

7. Cultural Respect and Diversity:

- We celebrate cultural diversity as a strength.
- Different perspectives enrich our society, and we commit to promoting respect, understanding, and appreciation for all cultures and identities.
- We welcome the stranger.

8. Innovative Solutions:

- We support, in all our solutions, the integration of Nature's design features: fractal, symbiotic, balanced, diverse, cyclical, subsidiarity—vesting power at the lowest level. (Jeremy Lent, *The Web of Meaning*).
- All organized human activity, including commerce, will be purposed to partner for the greatest common good and to share resources in all endeavors using creativity and innovation and abiding by the rule of subsidiarity, vesting power at the lowest levels
- We embrace creativity and innovation, particularly the decentralization of power and governance; the adoption of ProSocial practices and natural design (biomimicry—<u>Tamsin Woolley Barker</u>) as shared tools for solving the complex challenges we face.

9. Love Force, Spirit Force, Oneness:

- Sustained in ever-widening circles of practice, we embrace the forces of 'power-with' that nurture an ethos of oneness, mutual respect, care, nonviolence.
- We welcome the stranger.
- We recognize the rights of all people and the powers of love and spirit to live in harmony with each other as equals seeking the good of all.

The Fourth Major Macroshift Mythos—Theos—Logos—Holos

Macroshift, Ervin Laszlo

The Great Turning

Joanna Macy called this time the Great Turning.

The vast majority of human beings are now so systemically disempowered that it feels wholly possible that the human species will not recognize, and thus not survive, the rising danger of the ecological and societal catastrophes of our own making.

The great sweep of humanity's march toward a world that is sustainable and hospitable to humans and life itself is within our grasp <u>if</u> we choose a new relationship with each other, with life, and with Earth as **Caretakers** and as **Stakeholders** in our shared fates.

In *Macroshift*, Dr. Ervin Laszlo provided us with the context to understand the magnitude of the historical moment we are in.

Mythos to Theos: Mythos describes the macroshift from the time of the Paleolithic huntergatherers to our Neolithic forbears 10,000 years ago, who settled along riverbanks. These early humans considered themselves both natural and spiritual beings. The Neoliths settled in the valleys, developed agricultural technologies and toolmaking. The tribal circles were replaced by more complex, strict hierarchical power-over, stratified societies, organized "as above, so below" from supreme deities to the "divine right of kings". Theocratic rule made order out of the wonders of universal chaos.

Theos to Logos: The new technologies and continued population growth led to a new human-centered ethos, with an emphasis on 'man'. The dominant *religious* nature of the first half of Logos was followed by the rise of the *sciences* leading to a mechanistic-materialistic-technocratic worldview: *I think therefore I am*.

Hierarchical, power-over mixed with egocentrism and the unrelenting pursuit of profit and greed produced systemic exploitation of human beings and natural resources in pursuit of **Growth-Greed-Capitalism**, as part of a culture of ecocide.

As a great tide of humanity, let us lend our shoulders to the wheel of transformational change for the good of all.

1. Recognize! Our Future Is In Our Resilient Hands

"We cannot solve our problems with the same thinking we used when we created them."

Albert Einstein

As we stand now on the threshold of **Holos**, the existential costs of humanity's plundering of nature for the benefit of the few is threatening the survival of our species. By re-energizing our latent stores of resiliency through the practices of Circle, and by organizing and mobilizing humans to reconnect to our essential natural, physical, and spiritual oneness we reclaim our collective resiliency.

Resilient people co-create resilient communities. Communities that are not resilient will disappear.

2. Realize! We the Ones We Are Waiting For

"The most intractable problem today is not pollution or technology or war; but the lack of belief that the future is very much in the hands of the individual."

Realize that you are a descendant of just a few thousand ancient ancestors who **migrated** out of Africa roughly 60,000 years ago. Their codes are embedded in every human being on Earth. We know how to do this.

Realize that your collective hero's journey will be guided by the wisdom of the past, inspired by the promise of new transformation, and grounded by stakeholders in communities of belonging.

Realize that while humanity's systems have acted destructively toward nature, human beings can choose to set a new course to act in harmony with nature.

Realize that this means we must consciously adapt our behaviors, individually and collectively, to reject the choices and systems that are killing us.

Realize that when you choose to engage and act purposefully and intentionally with others, you will be supported on a new Shared Path that leads ultimately to a transcendent state of Oneness.

Together we are One. We emerge <u>resilient</u>, nurtured by the power of nature, evolution and community, and energized by the "belief that the future is very much in our hands."

3. Decentralize & Localize!

Thirty thousand years of increasing segmentation and concentration have *centralized* power-*over* (domination) in the hands of an ever-more greedy oligarchy, which plunders and exploits every resource, including humans themselves, for the benefit of the few. At the other end of the domination spectrum, Riane Eisler reminds us that we can choose partnership.

Earlier—*decentralized*—indigenous civilizations who exhibit deep awe and reverence for all life, for Nature and Spirit, still walk this path.

The path of **Localization** has been ever present in human affairs. Notably it was revived in 1973 by E.F. Schumacher in *Small Is Beautiful: Economics As If People Mattered* and it set the roots for the indefatigable support of many, many others and in particular in the practical solutions by the localist Michael Shuman and the online communities at <u>The Main Street Journal</u> and **AMIBA**.

Switzerland, as a current example of decentralized governance, lacks a powerful central government and operates from the bottom up, as a confederation of almost sovereign counties and provinces. Not only is governance from the bottom up possible, it is how nature works and how some groups are successfully adopting Elinor Ostrum's Nobel-prize winning 8 Core Design Principles For Governing the Commons— now re-formulated in a collaboration between Ostrum and the evolutionary biologist David Sloan Wilson into the ProSocial World evolutionary movement— which is already teaching and demonstrating the feasibility and benefits of decentralized community self-governance.

Furthermore, history has recorded such egalitarian communities in ancient Indigenous cultures (*The Dawn of Everything*, Graeber and Wengrow) and there are many more recent precursors: Gandhi's *Villages movement*, Dr. Ariyaratne's *Sarvodaya*, the *Holomovement*, *Sociocracy*, eco-villages, biomimicry, decentralization is even embraced in *Open Source* programming. https://opensource.com/open-source-way)!

The culture of domination that concentrates power-*ove*r in the hands of the few is <u>already</u> in free fall, partner up in Circle with your fellow citizens, and <u>let domination go!</u>

Evolution reminds us, that we have some unique human advantages: "Selfishness beats altruism within groups. Altruistic groups beat selfish groups. Everything else is

commentary." E.O Wilson and David Sloan Wilson. And <u>"A group of cooperators can robustly out-compete a group whose members cannot cohere."</u> David Sloan Wilson

4. Movement Building: Organize, Mobilize, Strategize!

If you don't know where you're going and you have no plan, no amount of strategic nor tactical prowess will get you there. However, once we clearly identify our desired outcomes and vision—the good of all and Oneness in this case—we can chart a viable course.

Nature's plan, combined with common sense, gives us essential knowledge. It is balanced, fractal, symbiotic, diverse, and cyclical, reflecting the principle of subsidiarity, where lower levels impact the higher ones. (Jeremy Lent)

Gandhi's decentralized Villages movement affirms a simple and viable plan:

- (i) **organize** around <u>an ethic of nonviolence</u>; and
- (ii) **mobilize** and *vest power in the individual*; and
- (iii) **strategize** pathways *that lead to the good of all*.

Our current institutions, organizations and societies are clinging to systems that are designed to usurp individual power and hoard resources. Nature shares resources. When we align with Nature we tap into the power and flexibility of a multi-cellular system designed to facilitate mobility from the cell-to-cell and through the whole system. Nature's immense facility to co-create transformational change can propel humanity as an evolutionary tectonic force working *with* the power of Nature, not against it!

There are thousands of organizations already participating in this work, many focused on inspiring humanity to act. The Manifesto For The New Enlightenment provides them all with a clear pathway, to engage, unite, and weave a replicable strategy, and to effectively organize and mobilize the human superorganism Together as One. If not the Four Turns, what?

5. Engage: The Four Turns Shared Path—Me2We2Us2All

The Four Turns Shared Path facilitates organizing, mobilizing, around a common strategic framework that describes the change we want to see in the world and how we can combine strategically, to organize and share resources, structures, and supports to achieve the new world paradigm of the good of all, of Together as One, of a *ProSocial* World ™, of *Holos*. "Large-scale change is achieved by making small scale changes over-and-over again!" (Peter Block). It provides a compelling case for personal and collective engagement by answering the urgent call of co-creating an effective movement, NOW!

First Turn: Me-2-We: Healing individualism through belonging and stakeholdership. I am naturally altruistic and selfish. In the exploitative world of power-over, designed to separate us, I am an Atomized I. When I am grounded in love and compassion and realize that my fate is dependent on others just as their fate may depend on me, I am ready to step

on a Shared Path where we find a mutual support system as a *Thick We*, <u>aware</u> of our *Shared Fates*. <u>Recommended Resource: *The Art of Power*</u> (Thich Nhat Hahn)

Second Turn: We-2-Us: Transforming groups into inclusive communities.

Through the ancient practice of Circle or Sangha, Together as One, we move from 'Atomized I's to 'Thick We's. We experience the power-with of deep interconnection. We become stakeholders in our community. We rekindle the tangible reality of our shared fates. This fusion of our energy with the energy of others in Circle leads to new levels of self-awareness, self-actualization, and resilience. Recommended Resource: A Hidden Wholeness—The Journey Toward An Undivided Life-Welcoming the Soul and Weaving Community in a Wounded World. Parker Palmer.

Third Turn: Us-2-All: Expanding self-governance to serve the common good.

As we see with new eyes the reality of our deep inter-connection and interdependence, we restore an essential new 'right relationship' to each other and the world as Caretakers in communities of belonging, expressing our shared wisdom in communities of belonging.

Fourth Turn: Knowing-2-Doing — Turning awareness into regenerative action

David Bollier describes the commons as "an archetypal form of biomaterial intelligence...a commons [which] is not [just] a resource...It's a resource plus a social community and the social values, rules and norms that they used to manage the resource. They're all an integrated package. Call it a socio-economic-biophysical package, sort of like a fish and a pond and aquatic vegetation: They all go together and don't make sense as isolated parts.". Natural systems are inherently complex integral systems, where tiny fluctuations result in outsized impacts, a phenomenon known as the butterfly effect. (Edward Lorenz). Imagine the impact of positive 'fluctuations' of billions of people acting to improve our common wellbeing. In Cascades, Greg Satell describes how movements made up of "loosely connected small groups united by a common purpose...synchronize their collective behavior as networks". In Here Comes Everybody, Clay Shirky demonstrates that: "For the first time in history, the tools for cooperating on a global scale are not solely in the hands of governments or institutions."

All together as one, we become a formidable force to release the enormous resources trapped in the many silos of humanity's mis-designed systems. <u>Recommended Resources</u>: <u>ProSocial World</u> and the <u>Holomovement</u>

6. Energize: Naïve Prey or Better Ancestor

In 1935, when Charles Darwin visited the Galapagos Islands, he was amazed that the local birds could be approached without taking flight. He surmised that the absence of local predators resulted from prey naïveté. Today, humans are acting naïvely, engaging in the self-deception of indifference and especially apathy in the face of the enormity of ecological and societal systems collapse. We are *not* naïve prey. We *are Homo*

Sapiens...Wise Humans. Let's choose, as a species, to become wiser and better ancestors for all future generations.

Aspire To Be the Best Ancestor You Can Be

- You are the better ancestor future humans will cherish down through the ages.
- You are the change you want to see and be in the world. Reclaim your agency.
- You are co-creating a life-sustaining society that caters to the wellbeing of people and planet by reclaiming the governance of our commons. Be a stakeholder in life.
- Take one small step on the path today. Then another tomorrow. This is how Nature evolves. This is how transformation begins. This is how you transform the world.
- ➤ Join a Circle. Be a guide. Be a guardian. Be a circle-builder. Be a stakeholder in your community. Be a soul on fire for a future rooted in compassion, peace, and joy.
